- 1. Meeting was called to order at 6:20pm:
 - a. Stan Howe, Eric Lineback, Alex Wilson and Calvin Farwell were in attendance.
- 2. Welcome guests: No guests were present.
- 3. Reviewed agenda: No new items added.
- 4. Approved minutes from July 2, 2018 meeting:
 - a. Motioned by Alex.
 - b. Seconded by Stan.
 - c. Unanimously approved.
- 5. Portfolio Manager for municipal buildings update (Stan):
 - a. Stan completed online training regarding web app revisions.
 - b. Score on town office is now 22 out of 100.
 - c. ACTION: We need to update all our town energy data. Stan will coordinate a town office visit.
 - d. ACTION: Stan will attend next online training (201) and send follow-up materials.
- 6. DEC website update (Eric):
 - a. Updates are being finalized.
 - b. ACTION: Eric will send doc to Kevin when ready.
- 7. "No Idling" campaign update (Eric):

- a. Eric checked with Lee and confirmed that the town has signposts we can
 use. Ordered 6 new signs.
- Scott Farm is so far the only location that has agreed to put up a new sign. The school, it turns out, already has one.
- c. ACTION: Alex will reach out to Kampfires campground.
- d. ACTION: Eric will reach out to KOA, as well as coordinate outreach to all others.
- WRC REP Department of Public Service public hearing on June 5 in Townshend regarding determination of energy compliance – report and discussion of renewable energy storage options (Calvin):

- a. Calvin reported that the meeting was poorly attended. He noted that the "90% by 2050" goal appears unachievable without a significant increase in solar capacity.
- b. Calvin discussed the old Black Mountain quarry as a potential waterbased energy storage site in town (he calculated it would be approximately 1,000 KWH). He talked with GMP and found out they are only interested in systems 5,000 KWH or larger.

 DEC to pursue. If so, we will work on getting some quotes.
- 16. Potential future town purchase of Renaud gravel pit on Route 5 discussion (Eric):
 - a. This was just to get it on the radar.
 - b. Lee would like to attend a future DEC meeting to discuss.
 - c. ACTION: Eric will follow up with Lee.
- 17. Future projects: Promote electric vehicles and electric bikes? Town-approved solar park? Heat pumps? Energy storage (possible zinc battery array at the landfill, flywheels, Vernon)?
