# Minutes Dummerston Energy Committee Monday, March 1, 2021 @ 6pm Online via Zoom

- 1. Meeting was called to order at 6:02pm:
  - a. Eric Lineback, Calvin Farwell, Doug Morton and Alex Wilson were in attendance.
- 2. Welcomed guests: No guests were present.
- 3. Reviewed agenda: No new items.
- 4. Approved minutes from the February 1, 2021 meeting:
  - a. Motioned by Eric; seconded by Alex; unanimously approved.
- 5. West Dummerston Fire Department (WDFD):
  - a. The consultant from Efficiency Vermont (EV) completed the cost savings analysis based on upgrading the overhead doors; Eric will now be able to finalize and submit the report.
  - b. ACTION: Doug will follow up with EV about any incentives they may be able to offer.
  - c. ACTION: Eric will research propane pricing data to determine an ROI, finalize the report and send to WDFD.
- 6. Covered bridge lights:
  - a. Calvin updated us on his continuing research.
  - b. ACTION: Calvin will continue gathering specs and cost info for several good/better/best options, including motion and dimming options.
- 7. Vermont 2022 Comprehensive Energy Plan (CEP):
  - a. Eric is working on comments regarding biomass/hemp as a possible pathway to achieving the state's goals.

- b. ACTION: Eric will complete a final draft of our comments, send to the committee for review, and then submit to the state.
- 8. Transportation Modernization Act (H.94):
  - a. Eric provided an update on a recent VECAN webinar he attended regarding this
    new piece of legislation and shared a presentation by Robb Kidd of the Sierra
    Club.
  - b. We will continue to monitor any developments.

#### 9. EVSE Grant:

- a. We revisited the idea of installing an EV charging station along Route 30 in Dummerston; possible sites include the Park & Ride lot at the covered bridge or Maple Valley.
- b. The current EVSE grant program has been exhausted, but more funds may become available through the TMA (see above).

#### 10. Weatherization for All initiative:

- a. Eric provided an update on this initiative, also being called the "Warm and
   Healthy Homes" program, designed to create jobs and combat climate change.
- The Senate Committee on Natural Resources and Energy is calling on the state to weatherize 120,000 homes over the next 10 years.
- c. We will continue to monitor any developments.

#### 11. Local state reps meeting:

- a. ACTION: Eric will invite our local state legislators to an upcoming DEC meeting.
- 12. Allard Lumber CHP system tour:
  - a. We discussed and decided to wait until spring for a tour, because of both COVID-19 and the winter weather.

#### 13. Potential new DEC member:

a. We continued the discussion and planned for follow-up.

b. ACTION: Eric will reach out to the candidate.

## 14. 2021 Projects & Goals:

a. Due to time constraints, we tabled this continued discussion until next month.

### 15. New business:

- a. We discussed hydrogen fuel cell electric vehicles (FCEV), and in particular the technology that Toyota is working on; this could be the future of electric vehicles.
